

The Santa Clara County Leather Association is a social and educational leather club. To nurture the club and support community, we perform outreach to new leather folk and sponsor some fundraising events for charity. The SCCLA is a pansexual group, rooted in the gay and lesbian leather community. We are open to all orientations and genders.

SCCLA has three regular monthly events:

•Our monthly business meeting, held at 7:30 P.M. on the first Thursday of the month at the Billy DeFrank LGBT Community Center.

•The "Bar Schmooze" social, held from 9 P.M. to midnight on the first Friday of the month at Renegades Bar.

•The "Dinner Schmooze" social, held from 8 P.M. to "whenever" on the second Thursday of the month, currently at House of Pizza in San Jose.

Membership in SCCLA is not required to attend any of these events, although on occasion guests may be excused from the room in the business meeting.

The Santa Clara County Leather Association has always operated by consensus, with very little heirarchy and no formal officers. In our early years, the Imperial Royal Lion Monarchy, Inc. of San Jose very kindly allowed SCCLA to operate under its non-profit umbrella. Two and a half years ago, consensus was reached to become a formal membership club and we moved under the umbrella of the Billy DeFrank Lesbian and Gay Community Center.





This year's art is from Dave Carranza and Kevin Roche.



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



In 2005, Lance was acknowledged by his peers in SCCLA when he was awarded Member of the Year.


